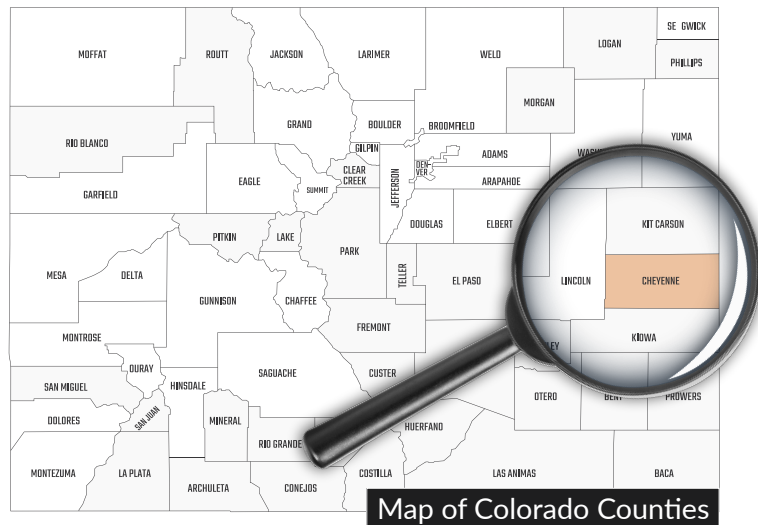

Map of Colorado Counties

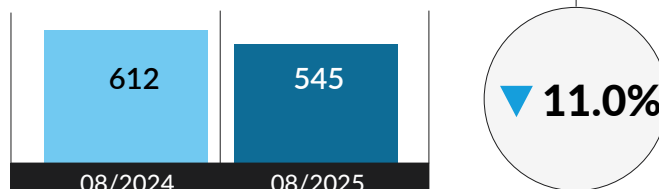
Year-Over-Year County Enrollment

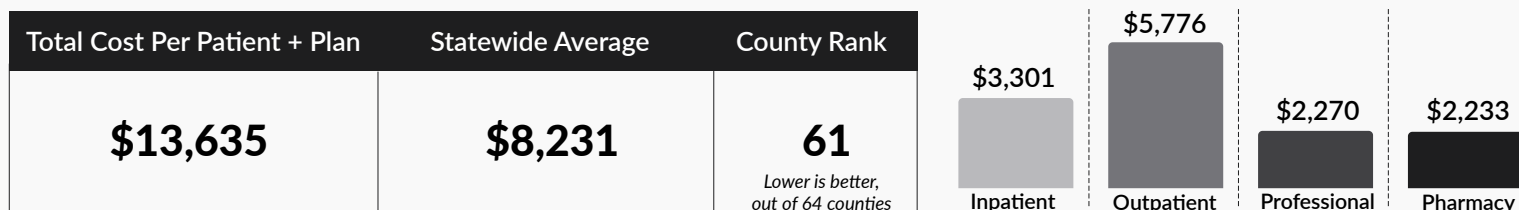

County Trends and Notes | All measures reflect data from the [Community Dashboard](#) (2013 -2023)

- People living in Cheyenne County **spend more on health care** (plan + patient, per person per year) than in most Colorado counties. In 2023, the average spending on care per person per year in Cheyenne County was \$13,635 compared to the statewide benchmark of \$8,231 and rural county benchmark of \$9,534. Overall, Cheyenne County ranks 61 out of 64 counties in spending on care (ranked lowest to highest), making it among the top three counties in the state with the highest spending on care.
- Cheyenne County has a **lower rate of health users**, or people accessing only routine care (such as preventive or minor-condition related claims), than most other counties. In 2023, Cheyenne County recorded a healthy user rate of 123 per 1,000 people compared to a statewide benchmark of 148 per 1,000 people and rural benchmark of 138 per 1,000.
- Cheyenne County **consistently has a lower rate of eligible people who receive breast cancer screenings** compared to other Colorado counties. In 2023, eligible people in Cheyenne County received screenings at a rate of 49%, notably below the statewide benchmark of 63% and rural county benchmark of 61%.
