This was a key goal of the CO APCD enabling statute and is core to CIVHC’s mission. As a result, CIVHC does not take stances on policy initiatives other than when they directly impact our ability to administer, enhance, and utilize the CO APCD for its intended purpose.</p> <p>As the CO APCD has become more integral to the policymakers across the state, there have been requests that could appear to put CIVHC’s objectivity into question when published. This concern has in turn raised questions about how to handle requests that may technically be in compliance with our statutory purpose, but may be against public health interests or against existing evidence. The guidance originally provided by the CO APCD Advisory Committee has served CIVHC well over the past ten years, but our evolving role requires further consideration and guidance to retain our position as a politically neutral resource to benefit the people of Colorado.</p> <p>In addition, we have recently had timing conflicts that have conflicted with the standard Advisory Committee review of public releases, where due to policy requirements, a public report needed to remain confidential for a period before publication. With a comprehensive pre-publication confidentiality process in place with the Advisory Committee, we could continue to have the Committee review reports in a timely manner without compromising policy priorities.</p> <p>We’d like to ask the Committee to help provide input in developing a framework to solidify CIVHC’s role as neutral administrator regarding releases of CO APCD data, and confidentiality of the review process by external stakeholders.</p>
