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Committee Discussion and Questions

- Lucía provides brief overview of request
- Project team joins call and shares further details
 - Nathan: The children of these patients would often face adverse birth outcomes.
 Considering this higher rate of issues that the children may have, are you controlling for that factor in your study?
 - Client responded yes that they will be controlling this based on the ICD 9 and 10 codes that they will be receiving but they cannot really see the language exposure through the data to control for the reading outcome.
 - Nathan: construction of control group would you need to look at creating one that matches those comorbidities so that you're looking at like populations?
 - Client responded that they will limit based on the system and not the comorbidity because those providers can change over time.
 - Andy: from codes that identify parents, would they get detail of deaf or hard of hearing pre-laterally.
 - Client responded that this is a limitation of the study but they'd ideally like to do that. They just won't be able to get that detail from the CO APCD.
- Project team drops from call and Kelsey requests further questions from the Committee
 - Ako: concern about amount of data being requested. Recommends limiting control group. Looking to make these groups being requested smaller geographically and diagnostically.
 - Nathan: Agrees with scale of population being too large.
 - Lucia: Agrees with providing a recommendation for control group being controls that have similar zip codes and similar diagnoses (outside of deaf and hard of hearing diagnoses)
 - Essey: Are we requiring this or asking this be a recommendation? Wants to support this application while also protecting unnecessary PII from being released
 - Lucia: recommends only including DOB for the 0-2 age group and not DOB for other people. Ask CDPHE for crosswalk of matched people, then randomly choose amount of control from there.
 - Martha: Destroy data that's unnecessary each step of the way Kelsey agrees

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• Kelsey: Any objections if they reduce this to a 10:1 ratio for control of this study.

Committee Discussion and Questions

- Amanda provides brief overview of request
 - Originally presented at the January 2025 DRRC meeting; Beth, Ako, and Nathan voiced objections to production.
 - Kelsey reviews HIPAA requirements/considerations for data uses to support public health activities: <u>Disclosures for Public Health Activities | HHS.gov</u>
- Project team joins call and shares further details
 - They want to go deeper in their exploration of claims data they've already received for 2021. They've provided a code list for reconsideration.
 - Shared further justification for PHI requested and why they need at the very least First name, last name, and DOB for the Melissa "Personator." In addition, presented further justification for PHI requested and why they need at least birth year for the origin destination mapping.
 - Offered just holding PHI for the time it takes to make the calls if that would make DRRC more comfortable.
- Project team drops from call and Kelsey requests further questions from the Committee
 - Ako: still overall concern for amount of data. CDPHE is multiple state agencies but there are several groups that have various access to data. Some of those entities could not claim that they're entities for public health. However, he agrees that the list of diagnosis codes do help narrow this request down.
 - Essey: behavioral health codes, any concerns there? Some SUD diagnosis codes are in there, any challenges for releasing PII related to that?
 - Kelsey: all SUD codes are sequestered in our system and don't get released. The SUD code list CIVHC uses to determine sequestering is from HCPF and ResDAC.
