## What is the Health Equity Fund?

- The Health Equity Fund, a partnership between the Center for Improving Value in Health Care (CIVHC) and the Colorado Health Foundation (CHF), provides support to Colorado communitybased nonprofit organizations focused on health equity.
- Funds offsets costs associated with accessing CIVHC's services, including <u>Colorado All Payer Claims</u> <u>Database (CO APCD)</u> data and <u>evaluation services</u>.

# What is the goal of the Health Equity Fund?

• The goal of the funding is to help organizations that often face barriers with accessing data unlock the information and services they need to accelerate their health equity work.

#### How much funding is available?

- $\circ$  \$250,000 in funding will be allocated per year, over four years.
- Organizations will be eligible for up to \$50,000 in support services annually.
- Note: Organizations will not receive funding directly, but will access subsidized services directly through CIVHC.

## What organizations and projects are eligible for support?

- Eligible organizations included Community-based nonprofits in Colorado with less than \$10 million in annual operating revenue. Organizations with annual operating revenue over \$10 million will be considered on a case by case basis.
- Community-based organizations are defined as nonprofits that represent the community and can demonstrate that community members drive its work and directly benefit from its services and mission.
- All projects must focus on advancing health equity:
  - Primary focus areas are housing access, food security, and maternal and fetal health.
  - Other areas including, but not limited to, primary care, mental health, early childhood social and emotional well-being, Coloradans of color, and LGBTQ+, will also be considered.

## What organizations and projects are eligible for support?

- Applications are accepted on a rolling basis and will be awarded on a first-come, first-served basis.
- Applications are reviewed by the Health Equity Fund Review Committee, comprised of data experts and community engagement leaders from CIVHC, CHF and external community-based organizations.
