

Community Dashboard Annual Check Up

The Preventable ED and Hospital Visit Checkup shows a positive decline in Coloradans using the ED and being hospitalized for potentially preventable reasons, and a decrease in unplanned hospital readmissions. Potentially preventable ED and hospitalizations range from ear infections and urinary tract infections to high blood sugar and asthma attacks conditions that can often be prevented and treated in an urgent care or doctor's office setting. Similarly, readmissions can often be prevented by improving communication during the discharge planning process, and enhancing care coordination with providers and caregivers after discharge. Potentially preventable visits pose a health risk for patients, and they are also costly. Communities can use this information to understand how their potentially preventable visits compare to other areas in Colorado, and identify where they have opportunities to reduce potentially unnecessary visits and improve health outcomes.




Preventable ED Visits, Hospitalizations and Unplanned Readmissions are Decreasing




Potentially Preventable Emergency Department Visits
