2:10 – 2:30	Administrator Updates – Kristin Paulson, Paul McCormick, Liz Mooney <ul style="list-style-type: none">• KPI updates• CO APCD Scholarship• Health Equity Fund• CO APCD RFP Update Summary: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Customer satisfaction at 91% (goal 85%); Submitter Quality Index (SQI) held steady at 95% (consistent with goal); Clients: 28 new, 19 returning (both below targets). Website and public report usage are making progress toward the 10% growth goal.• Scholarship Program: \$500k fully allocated to 17 projects.• Health Equity Fund: \$632,648 worth of services have been committed since the fund’s inception, with \$380k of loan forgiveness realized in the current year.<ul style="list-style-type: none">○ Dr. Keller raised concerns about the potential risks of funding projects with the word “equity”; Kristin, Matt Ulrich and Maggie talked about CIVHC’s focus on ensuring legal compliance.• New vendor has been selected to minimize technical gaps and increase data accessibility: Onpoint Health Data contract begins July 1, 2025.
2:30 – 2:50	Funding Updates – Liz Mooney <ul style="list-style-type: none">• State Funding Update• Federal Funding Update Summary: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• \$1.1M reduction in state funding due to reduced scope, scholarship removal, and transition to federal sources.• Federal funding: House budget steps back from FMAP reduction but still significant Medicaid cuts looming; federal reimbursement shifting from 90/10 to 80/20 for some services. CIVHC will continue to monitor Medicaid policy impacts.
2:50 – 3:10	Diversifying Funding Summary: The Committee brainstormed potential revenue sources: <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Partnerships with pharmaceutical companies, EHR vendors, and employers.• Tiered access models and modularized services to differentiate the APCD platform.• Roundtables, hackathons, and employer comparisons to increase visibility.• Potential collaborations with consulting firms like Milliman.
