





County Trends and Notes | All measures reflect data from the [Community Dashboard](#) (2013 -2023)

- Denver County has **experienced a steady decline in primary care use in recent years**. Rates increased from 2014 to 2019 but fell each year from 2020 onward. In 2019, the rate was 510 visits per 1,000 people. In 2023, it dropped to 459 per 1,000, the lowest level since 2015.
- Denver County has **experienced a steady increase in plan non-users**, or people who do not utilize their insurance, during the same period. In 2021, the rate was 186 per 1,000 people. In 2023, it rose by 47% to 273 per 1,000, the highest rate recorded since Community Dashboard tracking began in 2013.
- Denver County has a **relatively lower rate of pharmaceutical spending**. In 2023, the county ranked 20th (ranked lowest to highest) for pharmacy spending by health plan + patient, placing it in the top third of Colorado counties.
